
If you come, we expect you to join in — as we say in our monthly emails, "No singing talent necessary." Besides, singing is good for your health.

50 years of nearly continuous


publication, this issue of *The Fellowtarian* will be the last.

Times have certainly changed. Until 1990 "cut and paste" really meant cut and paste...with real paste.

In that year we switched to computer layout. But a lot of the work was still done by hand. Each month a group gathered to collate, seal, add address labels, zip-code-sort, and take to the post office for bulk mail delivery, the printed copies.

Cyndy Bullaughey took over for Kathy Iliff in 1978. Linda Sander joined Cyndy as co-editor in 1986, and I joined in 1997, helping with layout.

In 2000, we switched to all email digital -



with the exception of a few grandfathered folks who wished to keep receiving hard copy by snail mail.

Cyndy retired in the summer of 2002, and I became co-editor with Linda. In 2005 — as UCWC and its activities grew — we expanded from eleven issues a year (monthly except for single summer issue) to twelve. In 2016 we unveiled our current "look" with a new masthead and a more colorful design.

But the clock ticks. The time has come for Linda and me to retire...and with it *The Fellowtarian*. You'll still get all the news you need from Kelly Piscatello's comprehensive and well-designed weekly *Connections*. In addition, a new, monthly extended email with readings and resources is planned. Details to come.

#### **Parking Reminder**

Students are back in West Chester, and parking is once again tighter. To help make space near the building for those who need it, we encourage all who can to park in the West Chester Public Works lot on Lacey Street, two blocks east of the congregation.

From High Street go all the way up Magnolia past Matlack, follow the road to the right, go half a block, and turn left into the parking lot across from the Public Works building. It is a three-minute walk down Lacey Street to the congregation.

The Public Works lot is available on weekends except third Saturdays, and on evenings after 5:00 pm, as long as the borough is not engaged in snow and ice removal. Parking is also often available on Sharpless Street and along Walnut Street. Parking is free on evenings and weekends, and you do not need a residential pass. Carpooling is also encouraged.

This year we are going to try something new. The RE Committee has been researching a few different communication apps, and we would like to bring the BAND app to our RE families. This app — BAND — can be used on your phone or via a web browser. It will be a central hub for us to offer the latest updates, host our RE Calendar and signups, offer chat and messaging, and hold files and photo albums.

It will be a curated and safe space just for our families to connect and should enhance our communication about happenings without being overwhelming or getting lost in our emails. We will send out the invitations for you to join shortly, and we hope you will try it out with us.

#### **Our Whole Lives**

Every few years we offer a special program for our 8th and 9th graders, called *Our Whole Lives*, in which we explore a healthy relationship with sexuality and yourself. This program goes through some of the basic biology of our bodies, but goes further to practice living our values, making hard decisions, what healthy relationships look like, how we relate to portrayals in the media, dismantling myths, and more to foster safety and responsibility.


#### **Diversity Book Group**

Legacy by Uché Blackstock

Legacy is Dr. Blackstock's odyssey from child to medical student to practicing phy-

sician — to finally seizing her own power as a health equity advocate against the backdrop of the pandemic and the Black Lives Matter movement.



Growing up in Brooklyn, New York, it never occurred to Uché Blackstock and her twin sister,

Oni, that they would be anything but physicians. In the 1980s, their mother headed an organization of Black women physicians, and for years the girls watched these fiercely intelligent women in white coats tend to their patients and neighbors, host community health fairs, cure ills, and save lives.

#### **UUSC Update**

The Unitarian Universalist Service Committee (UUSC) has issued an Emergency Response Alert for donations to our Emergency Response Fund which currently helps people in Sudan, Ukraine, Haiti, and Bur-

ma. UUSC's Emergency Response
Fund delivers humanitarian aid
through its grassroots partners where people are facing
extreme violence and urgent threats
to their safety. Please donate here.

UUSC uses a Disaster Justice framework, which UUSC developed in collaboration with its partners and allies. Like mainstream humanitarian aid agencies, they respond to immediate needs in the wake of a crisis; yet, unlike those organizations, they also focus on removing barriers that prevent equal access to resources.

Their response evolves to meet essential needs as they change, including access to clean water, food, shelter, and other aid, as well as strengthening protections for people at risk for gender-based violence and combating the displacement of Black, People of Color, LGBTQI+, migrants, and refugees.
